Political Signs, banners and/or flags: Per the Rules these items are allowed to be displayed ONLY for NATIONAL elections and may NOT be placed in yard or on home more than 60 days before the national election day. 2024 National election day is November 5, 2024 so no signs may be placed prior to September 6, 2024. No signs, flags or banners are allowed to be displayed where visible for any other local or state elections, only the NATIONAL Presidential election.

Reminder on lamp posts: per the rules and regulations of the park; each home is required to have an operational lamppost that must be illuminated during evening hours (dusk to dawn) and must be operational year around. Please make sure that your lamppost is in compliance.

Hurricane preparedness: We are still in the midst of hurricane season. Debby threw us for a loop but it could have been much worse. Our drainage, lakes and ditches did a good job in keeping the many inches of rain in 2 days from intruding into homes. Considering the amount of rainfall received and the flooding elsewhere locally, CLV is fortunate. Please remember to secure anything that could become a projectile, for the safety of all.

<u>Gate Update:</u> Any update will be circulated via email & on Facebook. We still have clickers in stock for those that have not gotten one. \$20 <u>check or money order</u> made payable to Country Lakes for the deposit of each clicker.

<u>Parking:</u> There is no overnight parking allowed at the clubhouses or on any street. Steve White Towing has been authorized to patrol the communities at night and tow any violators. Hopefully this will discourage this practice.

<u>Weeds:</u> It's that time of year, and weeds are prolific. Please make sure you make arrangements to have this work done. CLV staff will do some, but I will be hiring a sub as our hands are full staying on top of the park's needs. The last work I had done averaged \$150 per lot depending on the work needed.

Country Lakes Village reserves the right to prune and or manicure any landscape inside CLV WHEN NEEDED at the home owner's expense.

<u>Clubhouse:</u> After many years, we found the pool leak and it has been repaired. We also discovered a leak in the clubhouse at CLV2 and that also has been fixed. Consequently, the pool shower tile at CLV2 was removed and replaced with new larger tile, and is a noticeable improvement. Thankful we didn't have to repair from inside.

Reminder to make sure the office is aware of what address you are getting mail at this time as its Rental Increase Letter mailing time (End of Sept) for new rates effective Jan 1, 2025. We mail to the address we have you at either your Park address if year-round resident or off-site address if you completed the check out form.

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#### MOVING FORWARD

Bob Miller, owner of Country Lakes Villages, has an Advisory Board in place, comprised of residents from both parks: CLVI-Sandy Gilbertson, Sue Eckert and Bruce Steltzer; CLVII-Sue Dibble, Laura Reynolds and Bree Borders with Dave Vossberg, Chairperson.

The Advisory Board continues to bring residents' concerns to the attention of the owner and management. We are working with them to create a Google survey which will go out to all residents of both communities. This survey will ask residents if they want the gates closed 24/7 or just overnight. We will try to include the pros and cons of both in the survey. Hopefully this will be coming soon.

Just a reminder that we will have several openings on the board. There is an application form on Page 5. Please consider applying for these openings if you feel you can objectively bring issues and concerns from residents to the Advisory Board.

As of the deadline of this publication, we have not yet met for this month. We will include updates from this month's meeting in next month's Gator Gazette.

Through the Advisory Board, resident issues are facilitated with Terry West, manager. A form has been created so that your concerns can be submitted in writing to any board member. Forms are available in both clubhouses and from any board member. (See Page 27). With Mr. Miller's approval, issues submitted to the board are those which affect more than one household. You are advised to deal individually with Terry West, manager, for personal issues.

The annual review of Rules and Regulations are done with the Resident Advisory Board. Other responsibilities include the revue and approval of social funds, the direction of improvements in the parks, along with other issues that may arise.



## Advisory Board Working For You Residents' Link to Management

The Advisory Board has adopted a new rule regarding its directors. Each Advisory Board member may serve two consecutive one-year terms and then cannot serve/reapply for one year after those two terms. This is being done to promote diversity and transparency.

In case you missed the results of the July 16 meeting with Terry published in last month's newsletter, the following topics were addressed:

We would like an update on the gate installation: Chain link fence will be installed up to the gate at all entrances. The gate installation is being handled by MHM.

Are there cameras at the entrances and if so, are they operational? The recent theft of a golf cart from CLVI has heightened everyone's awareness of security: Yes, cameras are operational at all entrances.

We would like a trash receptacle in the area of the large Tiki hut and cornhole court. One will be placed in the Tiki hut area.

We would like the community to be more aware of the benefits of recycling. Can there be a recycling container near the mailboxes. Most of the contents of the trash can are likely paper from junk mail and therefore recyclable: A recycling container will be placed in the mailbox area of both CLVI and CLVII.

Ice machine in CLVI status and do all MHM properties use the same ice machine? If so possibly MHM could have a spare on hand to put in place when any of the community's machines go down. A repair part arrived yesterday (7-15-24) and is in the process of replacement. Upon repair it will be returned to CLVI.

The Advisory Board would like to once again request that the new gates be closed 24/7. The board is working directly with Bob Miller on this, we are in the process of creating a google survey which will contain pros and cons of gates being closed 24/7. This will go out to all residents of both communities when completed.

The results of the Advisory Board meetings are posted on the bulletin boards of both clubhouses in the area marked Advisory Board and will be updated each month.





#### **Family Scams**

Scammers are good at **pretending to be someone that they're not**. They try to trick you into thinking **a loved one is in trouble.** 

Once the scammer makes you think they're your grandson and in trouble, they pressure you to quickly send them money. **But it's all a scam.**Your family member was never in trouble.

- The scammer will say it's **urgent** and that you're the only one who can help.
- The scammer might tell you it's **important to keep it secret**. They don't want you talking to other family members and friends and realizing it's a scam.
- The scammers will **play with your emotions.** They're counting on you to act quickly to help your family or friend. And they're counting on you to pay without stopping to check out whether there's really an emergency. If you get a call like this, you can be sure this is a scam.



#### Romance Scams

Romance scams occur when a criminal adopts a fake online identity to gain a victim's affection and trust. The scammer then uses the illusion of a romantic or close relationship to manipulate and/or steal from the victim.

The scammer's intention is to establish a relationship as quickly as possible, endear himself to the victim, and gain trust. Scammers may propose marriage and make plans to meet in person, but that will never happen. Eventually, they will ask for money.

If someone you meet online needs your bank account information to deposit money, they are most likely using your account to carry out other theft and fraud schemes.

#### **Tips for Avoiding Romance Scams:**

- Be careful what you post and make public online. Scammers can use details shared on social media and dating sites to better understand and target you.
- Research the person's photo and profile using online searches to see if the image, name, or details have been used elsewhere.
- · Go slowly and ask lots of questions.
- Beware if the individual seems too perfect or quickly asks you to leave a dating service or social media site to communicate directly.
- Beware if the individual attempts to isolate you from friends and family or requests inappropriate photos or financial information that could later be used to extort you.
- Beware if the individual promises to meet in person but then always comes up with an excuse why he or she can't. If you haven't met the person after a few months, for whatever reason, you have good reason to be suspicious.
- Never send money to anyone you have only communicated with online or by phone.
