<u>Inoperative vehicles</u>: No junk, inoperative or unlicensed vehicles may be used or parked in the community at any time. Owners will be given a 24 hour notice for removal prior to it being towed at their expense.

<u>Pet Owners</u>: Make sure to obey all rules regarding pets including do not walk your pet on any other Homeowners lot or in the amenity areas. Dog parks are provided or your own lot but pick up immediately after your pet.

<u>Speed limit:</u> Please drive slowly thru the communities. Our streets in the parks are not a thoroughfare. It is private property and speed

limit signs are posted everywhere. Please observe the 15 mph Speed Limit for Safety of All. Also please DO NOT cut thru the community clubhouse



lots to cut off a few seconds. There are always people milling about so if not going to the community clubhouse specifically, please avoid the lots.

Rain: The summer has brought record rainfall that soaked the community. Lawn mowing with a wet community resulted in mud tracks (depressions) that will go away after a few days. While regrettable, the community must be mowed and over all the community aesthetics are better for it. For those of you who enjoy complaining about It, relax, it has happened in the past and will happen again.

The paver driveways that were installed, need occasional maintenance by each homeowner. Placing polymeric sand in the joints regularly provides optimal joint stabilization, in addition to preventing weed growth. It holds installations together more homogeneously than conventional jointing materials. Polymeric sand is a very hostile environment for weeds and pest infestations (such as ants). You can buy it at Lowes or Home Depot or Ace.

MOVING FORWARD

Bob Miller, owner of Country Lakes Villages, has an Advisory Board in place, comprised of residents from both parks: CLVI-Sandy Gilbertson, Sue Eckert and Bruce Steltzer; CLVII-Sue Dibble and Bree Borders with Dave Vossberg, Chairperson.

The Advisory Board continues to bring residents' concerns to the attention of the owner and management.

Just a reminder that we will have several openings on the board. There is an application form within this publication. Please consider applying for these openings if you feel you can objectively bring issues and concerns from residents to the Advisory Board.

As of the deadline of this publication, we have not yet met for this month. We will include updates from this month's meeting in next month's newsletter.

When the Advisory Board was initially formed, it included equal representation from both communities. Through attrition that balance has shifted. Currently there are two board members from CLVII, three board members from CLVI and myself (Dave Vossberg) as Chairman, also from CLVI; however, I do not have a vote when the board needs to vote on items.

We, as a board, would like to have the balance restored to equal representation from both communities. So please consider applying for a position on the board so we may restore this balance. Applications need to be submitted to Dave Vossberg by October 14, 2024, to be considered for an open position.

Through the Advisory Board, resident issues are facilitated with Terry West, manager. A form has been created so that your concerns can be submitted in writing to any board member. Forms are available in both clubhouses, from any board member and within this publication. With Mr. Miller's approval, issues submitted to the board are those which affect more than one household. You are advised to deal individually with Terry West, manager, for personal issues.

The annual review of Rules and Regulations are done with the Resident Advisory Board. Other responsibilities include the revue and approval of social funds, the direction of improvements in the parks, along with other issues that may arise.

Advisory Board Working For You Residents' Link to Management

The Advisory Board has adopted a new rule regarding its directors. Each Advisory Board member may serve two consecutive one-year terms and then cannot serve/reapply for one year after those two terms. This is being done to promote diversity and transparency.

Items brought to Management on August 21, 2024:

Railing covers on pools and hot tubs in CLVI and CLVII: Terry will order and install covers in both parks. (As of 9/11/2024 this is complete.)

Entry lights at CLVII are not all working and need attention: 8/21/2024 Terry will have maintenance look at the lights and repair.

We would like to have maintenance check clocks at both clubhouses for correct time and battery replacement. Terry will have maintenance periodically check clocks and replace batteries as necessary.

Ice machine in CLVI status: A new ice machine has been installed.

We would like a trash receptacle in the area of the large Tiki Hut and Cornhole Court. One will be placed in the Tiki Hut area. (Completed as of 8/21/2024).

Additional Pool Chairs-CLVII. As of 9/10/2024 new chairs have arrived.

Hot Tub Resurfacing I and II: 8/21/2024 Terry continues to send emails to have bids approved. Maintenance will begin cleaning hot tubs weekly. They are both in good working order but need resurfacing.

Parking Violation in CLVI: 8/21/2024 Violators have been notified and as of this date are not parking in the lots. Terry will continue to monitor. **Completed**

Here's a quick reminder of some items to put in our Recycling bin after events in the clubhouse:

Please <u>Do Not</u> put these common kitchen items in Recycling:

- >> Garbage

- >> Sandwich bags, Saran Wrap, Shrink Wrap
- >> Any item with food or liquid still in or on them

We now have a Blue Recycling Bin from Manatee County that is kept by the mailboxes outside. The Indoor Recycling bin is located just inside the kitchen entrance. The Park Maintenance Crew will move the bin out to be picked up when needed.

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
