It is all for everyone's safety.

Judy Marshall stated that she appreciates MHM trying to improve the current smoking area. She would also like MHM to consider an additional smoking area at the back of the clubhouse past the tiki huts. This location would be at the far right if you are exiting out the back doors of the clubhouse.

Jim Roberts asked when the branches downed during the hurricane were going to be removed from the lakes/ponds in the community. Katie stated that they will be working on getting the debris from the lakes/ponds removed.




