Political Signs, banners and/or flags. -

Per the rules these items are allowed to be displayed ONLY for NATIONAL elections and may NOT be placed in the yard or on home more than 60 days before the national election day. 2024 National election day is 11/5/24 so no signs may be placed before 9/6/24. No signs, flags, or banners are allowed to be displayed where visible for any other local or state elections, only the

NATIONAL Presidential election.

Reminder on lamp posts: per the rules & regulations of the park; each home must have an operational lamppost that is illuminated during evening hours (dusk to dawn) and must be operational year-round. Please make sure that your lamppost complies with the rules.

Hurricane preparedness -We are still in the midst of hurricane season. Debby threw us for a loop but it could have been much worse. Our drainage, lakes, and ditches did a good job keeping the many inches of rain in 2 days from intruding into homes. Considering the amount of rainfall received and the flooding elsewhere locally, CLV is fortunate. Please remember to secure anything that could become a projectile, for the safety of all.

<u>Gate Update-</u>. Any update will be circulated via email & on Facebook. We still have clickers in stock for those who have not gotten one. There is a \$20 refundable fee to obtain a clicker for gate entry. This must be paid by check or money order made payable to Country Lakes for the deposit of each clicker.

Parking- There is no overnight parking permitted at the clubhouses or on any street within the community. Steve White Towing has been authorized to patrol the two communities at night and tow any violators. Hopefully, this will discourage this practice.

<u>Weeds</u>- It's that time of year, and weeds are prolific. Please ensure you make arrangements to have this work done if you are unable to complete it yourself. CLV staff will do some, and I will be hiring a

sub as our hands are full staying on top of the park's needs. The last yard work I had done averaged \$150 per lot depending on the work needed. Country Lakes Village reserves the right to prune and/or manicure any landscape inside CLV WHEN NEEDED at the homeowner's expense.

<u>Clubhouse</u>- After many years of trying to find the pool leak at the CLV2 pool, the leak was found and the pool has been repaired. We also discovered a leak in the clubhouse at CLV2 and that also has been fixed. Consequently, the pool shower tile at CLV2 was removed and replaced with a new larger tile and it is a noticeable improvement. We are thankful we didn't have to repair the leak from the inside.

Please ensure the office knows at which address you are currently receiving your mail. The 2025 lot rental increase letter will be mailed out to the residents at the end of September. These new rates will become effective on January 1, 2025. We will mail this letter to the address we have for you at your community address if you are a year-round resident, or your off-site address if you completed the checkout form.

place, comprised of residents from both parks: CLVI-Sandy Gilbertson, Sue Eckert, and Bruce Steltzer; CLVII-Sue Dibble, Laura Reynolds, and Bree Borders with Dave Vossberg, Chairperson.

The Advisory Board continues to bring residents' concerns to the attention of the owner and management. We are working with them to create a Google survey that will go out to all residents of both communities. This survey will ask residents if they want the gates closed 24/7 or just overnight. We will try to include the pros and cons of both in the survey. Hopefully, this will be coming soon.

Just a reminder that we will have several openings on the board. There is an application form on Page (4). Please consider applying for these openings if you feel you can objectively bring issues and concerns from residents to the Advisory Board.

As of the deadline of this publication, we have not yet met for this month. We will include updates from this month's meeting in next month's Gator Gazette.

Through the Advisory Board, resident issues are facilitated with Terry West, manager. A form has been created so that your concerns can be submitted in writing to any board member. Forms are available in both clubhouses and from any board member. (See Page 23). With Mr. Miller's approval, issues submitted to the board are those which affect more than one household. You are advised to deal individually with Terry West, manager, for personal issues.

The annual review of Rules and Regulations is done with the Resident Advisory Board.

Other responsibilities include the revenue and approval of social funds, the direction of improvements in the parks, along with other issues that may arise.

The Advisory Board has adopted a new rule regarding its directors. Each Advisory Board member may serve two consecutive one-year terms and then cannot serve/reapply for one year after those two terms. This is being done to promote diversity and transparency.

In case you missed the results of the July 16 meeting with Terry published in last month's newsletter, the following topics were addressed:

We would like an update on the gate installation: Chain link fence will be installed up to the gate at all entrances. The gate installation is being handled by MHM.

Are there cameras at the entrances and if so, are they operational? The recent theft of a golf cart from CLVI has heightened everyone's awareness of security: Yes, cameras are operational at all entrances.

We would like a trash receptacle in the area of the large Tiki hut and cornhole court. One will be placed in the Tiki hut area.

We would like the community to be more aware of the benefits of recycling. Can there be a recycling container near the mailboxes. Most of the contents of the trash can are likely paper from junk mail and therefore recyclable: A recycling container will be placed in the mailbox area of both CLVI and CLVII.

Ice machine in CLVI status, and do all MHM properties use the same ice machine? If so, possibly MHM could have a spare on hand to put in place when any of the community's machines go down. A repair part arrived yesterday (7-15-24) and is in the process of replacement. Upon repair, it will be returned to CLVI.

The Advisory Board would like to once again

request that the new gates be closed 24/7. The board is working directly with Bob Miller on this, we are in the process of creating a Google survey that will contain the pros and cons of gates being closed 24/7. This will go out to all residents of both communities when completed.

The results of the Advisory Board meetings are posted on the bulletin boards of both clubhouses in the area marked Advisory Board and will be updated each month.



Grandparent and Family Scams

Here's how they work:

You get a call: "Grandma, I need money for bail." Or maybe an email from someone claiming to be your brother or a friend who says they're in trouble. They need money for a medical bill. Or some other kind of emergency. The caller says it's urgent — and tells you to keep it a secret.

But is the caller who you think it is? Scammers are good at pretending to be someone they're not. They can be convincing: **sometimes using information from social networking sites**, or hacking into your loved one's email account, all to make it seem more real. And they'll pressure you to send money before you have time to think.

Here's what to do:

- Stop. Check it out. Look up your family member's phone number yourself and call another family member to check out the story.
- Pass this information on to a friend. You may not have gotten one of these calls, but chances are, you know someone who will get one — if they haven't already.

GUIDELINES FOR CLVII RAC RESIDENT EVENTS

- The event head count will not exceed 120 people for any event. The posted number of persons listed by the fire department shows 164 however, that number includes the library, game room, and fitness center. Those areas are not usually used during events.
- 2. All events are posted in the Village Voice, posters at the clubhouse, and on Facebook 3 weeks before the event. Tickets go on sale 3 weeks before the event. Check the posters and/or Facebook to determine who is selling tickets.
- 3. Events that are categorized as only entertainment will cost \$10 per ticket (refundable at the door). Since there is no food at these events tickets can be purchased up until the day of the event if tickets are still available. You must cancel within 48 hours of the event to receive a refund. Tickets must be returned to whoever is selling tickets for that event so they can be distributed to those on the waiting list, if any. You cannot sell or give your ticket(s) to anyone else. If you do not return your ticket within 48 hours of the event your money will not be refunded.
- 4. Events that are categorized as including food will cost \$20 per ticket (refundable at the door). The sale of these tickets will be cut off 7 days before the event to ensure we get a correct headcount to the caterer. You must cancel within 48 hours of the event to receive a refund. Tickets must be returned to whoever is selling tickets for that event so they can be distributed to those on the waiting list, if any. You cannot sell or give your ticket(s) to anyone else. If you do not return your ticket within 48 hours of the event your money will not be refunded.
- 5. Guest or family tickets are not refundable. They will also be placed on the waiting list and can only purchase tickets once all residents can purchase tickets. Usually, 10 days before the event if all tickets are not sold the waiting list people will get the opportunity to purchase tickets in the order they are on the waiting list.





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
